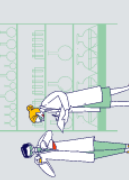
INTRODUCTION

1. Use of individual study plans

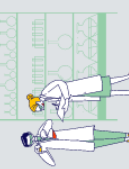

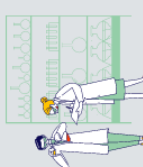
5. Using a variety of assessment techniques
