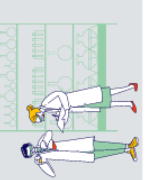

Government Initiatives

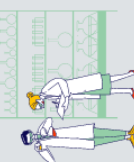

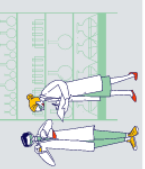

1. Enhance Infrastructure and Accessibility:

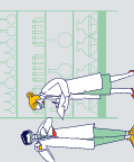
- Improve transportation networks to remote areas, making it easier for tourists to reach extreme tourism destinations.
