

# THE ROLE OF NARCOTICS AND PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCES IN SOCIETY

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## Abstract

A disease condition caused by temporary or chronic consumption of narcotic and psychotropic substances, addiction, or rather, natural or synthetic toxic substances (certain medicinal substances). Narcotics and psychotropic drugs cause profound changes in the somatic and mental state of the body and lead the addict to decline. In narcotic and psychotropic patients, there is an uncontrollable desire to use drugs, the need for the amount of the drug, and mental and physical dependence increase. Narcotics and psychotropics begin slowly and continue chronically. At first, drugs cause euphoria, euphoria (see Euphoria), and make you happy, and then it gradually turns into a disease. Narcotic drugs and psychotropic drugs can escalate in 2 days. In the first case, long-term and incorrect intake of drugs prescribed by a doctor and having the property of improving the patient's spirit and mood; to increase the amount (dose) of medicine in order to get rid of pain, insomnia and other ailments; even if there is no need for the drug after recovering from the pain, as a result of continuing to take it, the narcotic effect and quantity of the drug will increase, eventually the addiction to the drug will increase, and it will become a humor. The second case is the use of drugs for conscious pleasure.

## Introduction

Narcotics addiction has become a plague of our age. Drug addiction is the state of taking substances or medicines that are usually declared to be narcotics by law without a medical prescription. Today, it is noted that there are many types of drug addiction:  
- in morphinism, opium-like substances are used in medicine for pain relief and narcosis;



- hashishomania is popularly called addiction and addiction. It is common to smoke marijuana. This substance, also called cannabis, bang, can sometimes be chewed or consumed by drug addicts;

- cocaineomania is a highly dangerous, rapidly addictive type of addiction to synthetic drugs such as cocaine (or heroin). Cocaine can be injected intravenously or the powder can be snorted or inhaled. It should not be forgotten that the end of these habits is tragic.

- In heroin addiction, heroin is the most dangerous drug.

Drug addiction is a state of enjoyment by taking non-narcotic substances. The following types of drug addiction can be distinguished:

- toxicomania expressed by addiction to hypnotic drugs, i.e. barbiturates;

- lekomania, that is, toxicomania caused by abuse of tranquilizer, neuroleptic and antidepressant drugs;

- Nicotine addiction is the result of smoking a cigarette;

- toxicomania caused by taking large amounts of stimulants, amphetamines and caffeine.

The problem of combating illegal drug trafficking has already gone beyond the narrow, national and regional framework, and has become one of the most important problems that require the deep and practical attention of the entire world community. That is why the illegal transportation of narcotic drugs is an international crime, and the fight against it is carried out on the basis of a number of international conventions. These include the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs (1961), the Vienna Convention on Psychotropic Substances (1971), and the UN Convention against Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (1988).

Among the first tasks, the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan paid special attention to the activation of our common fight against drug trafficking. In particular, he said: "We are in favor of large-scale cooperation in the fight against this evil. It is no secret that the majority of the narcotic substances produced and consumed in the world are produced in Central Asia or transported through it. The fact that the transit routes of the drug business are concentrated in one region is a sufficient reason for the world community to concentrate and use its capabilities to end this terrible phenomenon. Uzbekistan is ready to cooperate with all interested countries and organizations in this regard." We would welcome the creation of a UN regional commission in Central Asia to coordinate joint efforts in the fight against drug trafficking."

Later, our country actively participates in the process of solving this problem at the international level. This is evidenced by Uzbekistan's official accession to the specified conventions in 1995, 1961, 1971 and 1988, and the signing of inter-agency and governmental agreements on cooperation in the fight against drug trafficking with more than twenty countries. .

The State Commission of the Republic of Uzbekistan on the control of narcotic substances was established in order to jointly implement the UN international drug control program and the plans of the government of the Republic of Uzbekistan.

The new list and quantity of narcotic substances of the State Commission of the Republic of Uzbekistan on the implementation of the new Criminal Code of the Republic of Uzbekistan and control of narcotic substances was approved. According to them, criminal responsibility for illegal transfer was strictly defined. Based on this, some problematic issues may arise in the practice of law enforcement. Illegal transportation of narcotic drugs or psychotropic substances is the most socially dangerous act, like illegal drug dealing. Narcotics and psychotropic substances, strong influence and mind-stealing substances are artificially prepared substances or naturally grown plants or their parts, and should be controlled in accordance with the Criminal Code of the Republic



of Uzbekistan and international agreements. are substances included in the list approved by the commission on drug control. According to Article 272 of the Criminal Code of the Republic of Uzbekistan, the illegal transfer of narcotic drugs or psychotropic substances is punishable by imprisonment from five to ten years. Illegal transfer of narcotic drugs or psychotropic mods in more than a small amount is punishable by ten to twenty years of imprisonment or death.

Based on the above, the concept of illegal transfer means the illegal transfer of drugs from one's illegal possession to another person's possession. It is possible to talk about the purpose of transferring narcotic drugs or psychotropic substances only when the intention of the offender to give the specified substances to at least one person (for example, an agreement with consumers or intermediaries) is proved. The amount of narcotic drugs or psychotropic substances used for the qualification of the specified crime is not important.

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
