Smith and Harper (2019) did some researches based on the study with 45 elementary students, comparing traditional repetition-based drills with gamified pronunciation exercises. The results demonstrated that students participating in interactive games and activities not solely improved their pronunciation but also learned content for a longer period. According to the technological advancements, Thompson and Lee (2023) explored the integration of pronunciation apps like Elsa Speak and application like this which provided feedback on pronunciation accuracy. Admittedly, majority learners nowadays use this apps to enhance their pronunciation skills as this Else speak applications can provide relevant feedback at the same time and teach how to correct them while pronouncing the words. Finally, music is also crucial role to improve the pronunciation. According to some researchers Students read aloud a song lyric with highlighted end consonants, and the instructor listens to see how the performer pronounces them.(2021, Abduramanova).

METHODS

The research according to the tips to improve the pronunciation for the elementary level students was prepared based on the survey which were used by other researchers. In this case, using video aids and repeating the songs can help the young learners to improve their accurate pronunciation skills. Students remember words and patterns better with songs. Students should read song lyrics aloud to improve final consonants. PROCESS STEPS

At the beginning of the process according to the research, researcher start with teaching basic vowels and improving pronunciation skills among elementary learners can be approached effectively through an engaging, interactive, and structured process. Here's an experimental step-by-step method to achieve this. Starting with teaching the basic vowel and consonant sounds. Use flashcards with pictures and phonetic symbols to contribute the learners associate sounds with words. Play audio recordings of each sound and have students repeat after it. Use clear and slow pronunciation to model the correct way of saying a word. Incorporate visual materials such as, mouth diagrams or use a mirror so learners can observe the movement of lips, tongue, and teeth while producing the sound. Next activity that researcher did was that repetition drills by using common words and phrases as well. Words like differences between 'bat' and 'pat'. In order not to get bored, some pronunciation games also included. At the end of the research lessons relevant feedback was provided by the instructors. At the end of the research another survey was taken from the pupils of all the same aged learners and it showed that experimental group indicated top-notch results and higher scores in terms of pronunciation.

TOOLS



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




The chart illustrates the biggest challenges encountered when using technology for pronunciation lessons. The results are evenly distributed among three main issues: students' lack of interest, lack of access to devices, and technical issues, each accounting for 28.57% of the responses. A combined challenge, which includes all three factors, accounts for 14.29%. This indicates that no single challenge dominates, and a variety of obstacles contribute to variaty obstacles in using technology for pronunciation lessons.



This pie chart illustrates the responses to the question and the majority of participants (71.43%) chose "All of the above," which includes repetition and drills, games and interactive activities, and phonics-based teaching. Other responses included "Games and interactive activities" (14.29%) and "Other" (14.29%), while no votes were recorded for "Repetition and drills" or "Phonics-based teaching" alone.





The chart provides the following information regarding the best strategy for correcting a student's pronunciation mistake and it is clear that the majority (85.71%) agree that gently modeling the correct pronunciation is the best strategy.

DISCUSSION

The survey results gives valuable information into effective strategies for teaching English pronunciation to elementary students. The findings showcase a strong correlation between specific teaching approaches and improved pronunciation skills among young learners at elementary schools. Importance of Repetition and Practice served as a critical factor in pronunciation improvement. Teachers who emphasized regular practice through songs, and practical records and repetitive exercises noted important progress in their students' ability to pronounce hard and difficult sounds. This finding underscores the importance of consistent reinforcement in pronunciation training during the lesson. Visual aids, such as flashcards and charts, along with auditory tools like recordings and apps, were found to enhance students' understanding of sound patterns. The survey suggests that multimodal teaching strategies combining visual, auditory, and kinesthetic elements—are highly effective in supporting young learners' pronunciation. Given feedback was identified as a vital component in building students' confidence and improving accuracy. Teachers who provided constructive feedback and celebrated small successes observed more motivated and confident learners. Having said that, survey period was not long as researcher expected, if it is long enough to practice, the results aslo will be higher than expected.

In conclusion, this article gives the information about the idea that teaching English pronunciation to elementary students requires a balanced approach, combining engaging activities, technology, and consistent practice.
