

TEACHING VERBS OF MOTION

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(development of a practical lesson based on the developed methodology for students of the 1st year of education

"Theory and Practice of Translation (English)"
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Abstract

The article presents the development of a practical lesson based on the created methodology for 1st year students of the direction of education "Theory and Practice of Translation (English)", conducted in eight groups at the Tashkent State University of Uzbek Language and Literature named after Alisher Navoi. The purpose of the lesson is to work out and consolidate verbs of motion conjugated by analogy in training exercises, which contributes to a quick understanding and memorization, as well as the active use of these verbs in oral and written speech by students. The article also discusses the etymological connections of Russian words with English words, which we consider as mnemonic devices that contribute to the easy memorization of new lexical units on the basis of associations.

Keywords: Development, practical lesson, methodology, lexical units, verbs of motion, Present Simple (P.S.), Present Continuous (P.C.).

Introduction

One of the topics studied in the Russian language classes is the topic "Verbs of motion".

"The topic "Verbs of Motion" causes great difficulties for students of the Russian language... These difficulties can be explained by the following reasons:

- 1) the richness of lexical patterns of verbs of motion;
- 2) the need to distinguish between the designation of movement with and without transport;
- 3) the presence of non-prefix and prefix verbs of movements;
- 4) the existence of imperfective verbs among prefix verbs, denoting unidirectional and non-directed, single and repetitive motion;



5) among prefix verbs - used paired and non-correlative verbs, verbs with various prefixes, often quite close by chance.1

In the lesson, together with first-year students of the direction of education "Theory and Practice of Translation (English Language)", we will consider the verbs идти-ходить, ехатьездить, куда?, as well as 36 new lexical units on the topic "Transport", presented in Table No 1.

It should be noted that the difference in the use of verbs of motion is easily explained with the help of two tenses of the English language: Present Simple (P.S.) and Present Continuous

(P.C.). The first indicates that the action takes place daily, regularly. Marker words are also important here, such as: every day, every month, every year, constantly, daily Present Continuous, i.e. a long extended time, indicates the action taking place at the moment of the speaker's speech, its duration. At the same time, the words that need to be paid attention to are now, at the moment. Let's consider the above with examples. If we want to talk about actions that occur regularly, then we use P.S. For example: I go to university every day. I go to the university every day. And we use P.C. to say the phrase: I'm going to the university now (I'm on the way). I'm going to the university now (I'm on my way). A similar explanation is given in relation to the verbs to go and to ride. Only during the explanation of the difference in the use of these verbs in the Uzbek group, it is necessary to focus on the fact that they walk on foot, i.e. on their own feet, and ride, i.e. move, on transport. It is important to conjugate the verb to ride in the present tense, because this verb causes difficulties even for those people whose Russian language is considered their native language. A typical mistake is the present tense form: often in people's speech you can hear: I go to work instead of I drive.

At the beginning, together with the students, in task No 1, we conjugate the verb (2nd conjugation) with the stress on the last syllable and with the alternation d/zh. With the change of the ending in the 2nd person singular to -ish and the ending -yat in the 3rd person plural:

The second task is aimed at working out the verbs to go and to walk.

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In practice, we have once again seen that the grammar of the English language, in particular the two tenses Present Simple and Present Continuous, helps to easily and quickly explain the difference between the verbs of motion - to walk and go, to go and to go - to students of the direction of education "Theory and Practice of Translation (English)". It is also necessary to recall the similarity of the Russian and English infinitives, the possibility of using both the infinitive and the nominal part of speech in English, which have been discussed a lot before, but due to the fact that this is not the subject of this article, we do not focus our attention on this.

It should also be noted as a note that students have already studied infinitive constructions in the previous classes, such as: I like to do, you can't do, as well as cases of nouns, so they easily cope with all tasks, in particular lexical, because the text contains many sentences for working out cases. Due to the fact that the article reflects only one development out of numerous classes, We consider this note to be appropriate.

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
